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From the Chaplain....

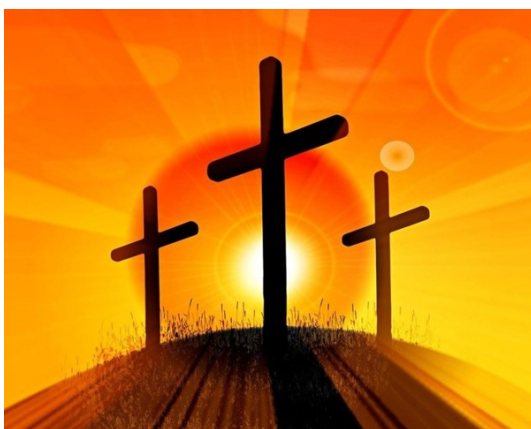
As Holy week approaches we turn our thoughts to Jesus' final humiliation and suffering on the cross. We remember how he was betrayed by his disciple Judas, with whom he had shared the last three years of his life. We remember how his disciple Peter, who had sworn to stand by him, denied even knowing him. We remember how the crowds who had shouted his praises just a few days earlier, now turned against him and called for him to be put to death. We remember how the Roman soldiers abused and humiliated him. We remember how some of his closest friends could not bear to stay as he breathed his last breaths and fled the scene. Jesus had been left to face death alone and felt himself abandoned even by his heavenly father.

There are times in each of our lives when we face challenges and often we can feel alone in facing them. There are times when life isn't fair, when we are falsely accused or betrayed by those we trust. We are aware of huge injustices in our world and when we reflect on them we may well ask, 'Where is God in all of this?' But ours is not a God who stays on his comfortable throne, distancing himself from the suffering of the world. Our God came down and suffered among us, as one of us, the worst humiliation and injustice that humankind had to offer. He knows what we experience, he feels what we feel. This, at least, offers some comfort in our times of trial.

But what of hope? Is this all there is? Will there be no justice? Will the innocent be left forever in their suffering? Is our God not good and powerful and will he not help us?

It was right at his lowest point, when Jesus looked most helpless, that God's transforming love was most powerful; for on the third day Jesus rose again. Through Jesus' death and resurrection death itself would be vanquished and a way opened up for each one of us to enter into an eternal relationship with God. God's plan for us is not that we live in isolation, facing life's challenges alone; but that we live in relationship with him and with one another, enjoying freedom and fullness of life together. And one day, all will be as he intended and created it to be. And all shall be well.
